In 2017, Dr. John Sibley Butler, America's preeminent Black entrepreneurship scholar, penned a 40-page blueprint for rebuilding inner city America and started the dialogue on how to solve the disappearance of jobs. The blueprint calls for Black America to stay focused on improving the educational attributes for future generations as the answer to solving the race problem in America.
